**Step 1** Log-in to online Lecture

The student clicks on the related link that has been received via email, or alternatively on the link that has been posted in the *Announcements* of the course webpage in the *mycourses* platform.

The link has the following typical format:


Then, the student clicks on the button **Join Meeting**




In the next page, the student types in her/his name and email address that she/he wants to appear during the lecture. Then, she/he clicks on the button **Next**.



In the next screen, she/he clicks on **Skip**.




Finally, **Join Meeting** is selected.



**CAUTION:** In the related messages that will appear in your browser window asking you to allow access to your microphone and/or webcam, press **Allow.** 





## **Step 2** Managing the online course

In the menu appearing at the bottom part of your screen various tools are provided.

Starting from left, the first and second option activates or de-activates the microphone and the camera, respectively. The immediately next choice (3<sup>rd</sup> from the left) allows us to share the screen of our computer. The choice in blue color opens a window at the right of our screen, where a list of all connected users is presented. The immediately next choice (3<sup>rd</sup> from the right) opens a window for text communication (chat) with the connected users, while the red button ends the session.



**CAUTION:** It is proposed that professors and students do not use their camera during the lecture, but only sound. The students should also have their microphones disabled (mute) during the lecture, and go ahead and enable their microphone only when they want to communicate with the professor, although for this case they also have the chat option (written text).
